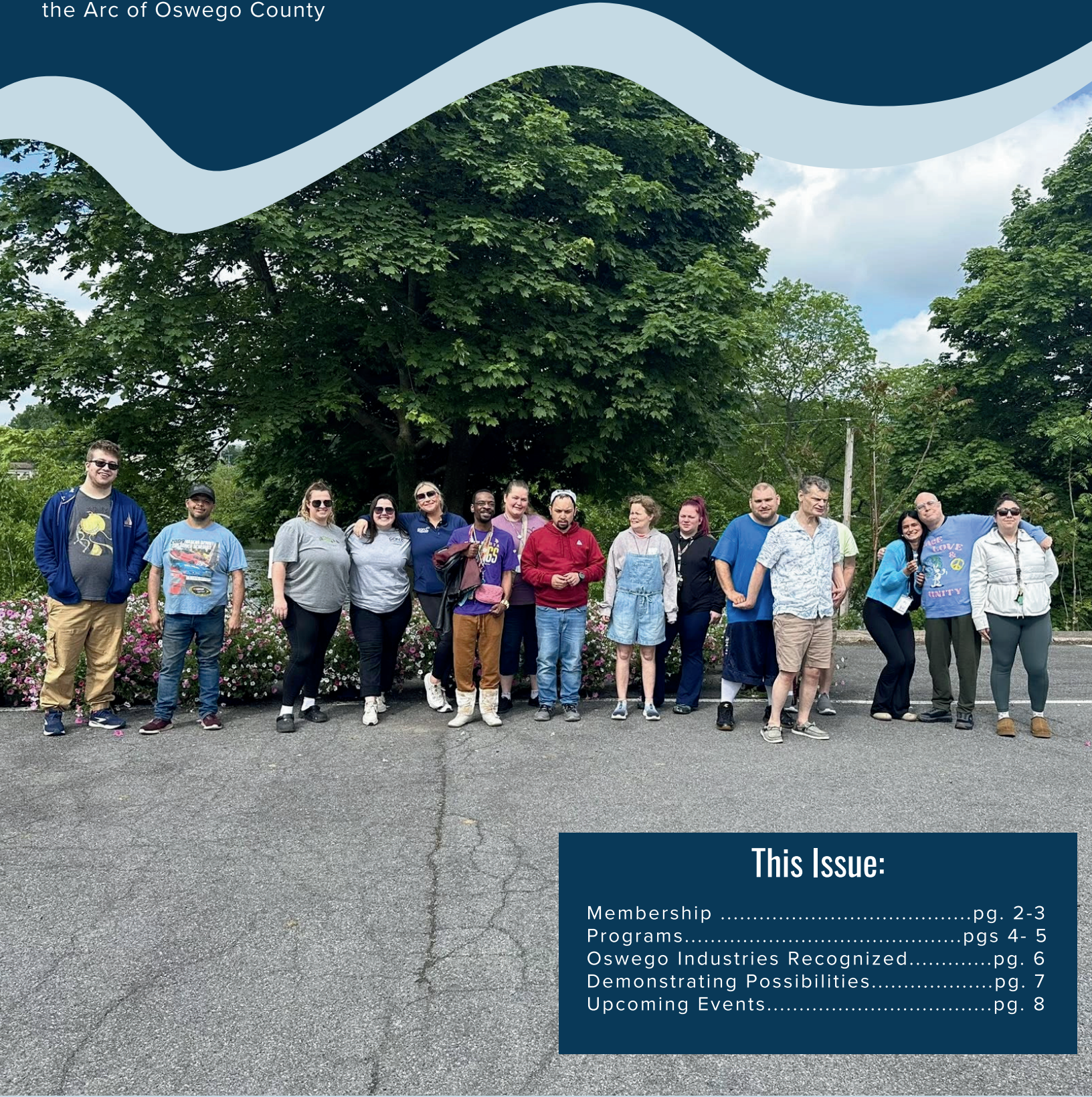

OSWEGO INDUSTRIES, INC. RECEIVES OPERATION OSWEGO COUNTY'S 2025 JOBS AWARD

FULTON, N.Y. — Oswego Industries, Inc. has been named the recipient of the 2025 Jobs Award by Operation Oswego County. The award was presented during the organization's annual meeting, held at the Lake Ontario Event and Conference Center in Oswego.

The Jobs Award is given each year to a business that has made a significant capital investment and contributed to the creation and retention of jobs in Oswego County. Oswego Industries was honored for employing more than 100 individuals with disabilities—165 employees in total—and for its long-standing impact on the local economy through contract work, textile manufacturing, and specialty services based in the city of Fulton.

In addition to job numbers, the award highlights the meaningful nature of the employment opportunities Oswego Industries creates. For more than 57 years, the nonprofit has remained committed to empowering people with disabilities to live fulfilling lives through employment and independence.

“This is one of the great things we’re able to do in our community,” said Allen Connely, president and CEO of Oswego Industries. “Coming from the private sector and now leading a nonprofit, I can tell you this work is uplifting. You get to see the impact you’re making on young people and older people alike. It’s incredibly meaningful.”

Connely also highlighted how Oswego Industries is investing in new technologies to expand its workforce and create more inclusive jobs for the future.

Most people don’t know that we’re also a Department of Defense contractor,” he said

. “We make all of the coveralls for mechanics in the Air Force. While that’s part of our legacy, we’re also investing nearly half a million dollars into new cutting technology to support higher-tech jobs for individuals with disabilities.”

Connely emphasized the importance of creating roles that allow individuals with varying abilities—including those with more severe disabilities—to contribute to meaningful work without being limited by physical dexterity.

“We’re putting that investment back into the community to open doors for people who are often marginalized,” Connely said. “This is about working side-by-side, creating real products, and contributing to something larger than ourselves. We’re proud of that—and we’re going to be part of this community for another 57 years, for sure.”

DEMONSTRATING POSSIBILITIES THROUGH VIRTUAL REALITY CAREER EXPLORATION

Over the past few months, our team has had the incredible opportunity to connect with educators, administrators, and program leaders throughout Oswego County to demonstrate the power of Virtual Reality for Career Exploration. These experiences have not only allowed us to showcase the exciting capabilities of this innovative tool but have also deepened our partnerships with those who share our mission to prepare students and adult learners for meaningful, independent futures.

Through immersive demonstrations, we've illustrated how Virtual Reality can spark curiosity, build confidence, and open doors to new possibilities. At each demonstration, participants were able to step into a range of real-world job environments—from healthcare and hospitality to manufacturing and emergency services—all within a controlled, supportive, and engaging setting.

We've been proud to work with the Oswego County Committee on Special Education (CSE), highlighting how this technology complements transition planning for students with IEPs. These simulations offer hands-on career exposure that helps students explore interests, build skills, and identify potential career paths well before graduation.

Our collaboration with BOCES has been equally impactful. We've connected with leaders across the Exceptional Education+, P-TECH, Career & Technical Education (CTE), SYNERGY, and Adult Education programs to demonstrate how our VR platform can enhance their existing programming. These sessions sparked exciting conversations about how virtual career exploration can serve students across a broad spectrum of abilities and goals, providing accessible pathways to employment readiness and vocational discovery.

We were especially honored to welcome the Central Square School District's Foundations Special Education Program for a guided tour of our facility. Students and staff had the chance to experience our VR Career

Exploration firsthand and see how we support individuals as they gain independence, learn workplace expectations, and explore career options in a realistic, hands-on way. Their visit reinforced the value of direct exposure and collaboration in creating bridges from school to adult life.

Each demonstration has reaffirmed what we already believe: when given the right tools and support, every individual can find their path. Through Virtual Reality, we're not just offering a glimpse into future careers—we're providing the first step on a journey toward greater independence, purpose, and possibility.

As we look ahead, we're excited about the new partnerships forming from these visits and the growing interest in bringing this experience to more classrooms, programs, and communities.

Let's continue to build a future where every learner has the chance to thrive—one simulation at a time.
